Woman of the Year 2024

Each year the Pennsylvania Federation of Democratic Women honors an outstanding woman as *Woman of the Year*. This award is announced at our annual convention on Saturday evening. This is an opportunity to highlight the achievements of our membership, but also serves as a fundraiser to support our annual Scholarship funds.

Criteria for Woman of the Year

The nominee must:

- Be a participating paid active member of the PFDW
- Encourage membership and involvement in the PFDW
- Show personal contributions to PFDW as well as the Democratic Party
- Regularly attend the PFDW Convention each year
- Be a mentor assisting women reaching their full leadership potential
- Believe in and support the ideals of the Democratic Party
- Provide a valuable service by devoting time and energy to improve the vision of the Democratic Party principles while enhancing the PFDW image

A completed nomination form with attached resume must be submitted for consideration by June 1, 2024. Each club and board member is asked to nominate a PFDW member they feel has demonstrated exceptional dedication and meets the required criteria in the previous year. From these nominations, the committee will tally votes and select this year's winner. Winners are NOT determined by the amount of money raised, only by vote totals. We request that you consider sending at least \$5 with your vote – but you are welcome to donate more to support future democratic leaders. Previous recipients are NOT eligible to be nominated again.

Additionally, we successfully re-elected our Democratic Commissioners, Sharon Laverdure and John Christy, while managing to keep out the "Woman for Trump" Christine Wilkins.

Democrats clinched victory in four out of the five row offices. A special acknowledgment is for John Huddleston, who came within less than 1 percentage point of unseating the long-time incumbent Republican, George Warden, for Prothonotary.

Our MCDW celebrated by hosting a "Cookie Party" at their final meeting of the year. Members brought a Democratic friend to join our group and cookies to share. We invited representatives from the Women Veterans Museum. They talked about plans for the upcoming expansion of the museum to add services for mental health counseling for ALL Veterans.


Members also made donations to the organization as part of our MCDW's annual holiday community service project.


